### New Rules for 2020 - 21 Virtual Solo and Ensemble

- The Huron Bands will only be participating in the **solo** portion of Solo and Ensemble Festival this year due to the new MSBOA regulations and AAPS COVID protocols.
- Solo and Ensemble Festival is an optional activity for all members of the Huron Bands this year, however if a student chooses to participate, all of their prior outstanding assignments will be forgiven.

#### Students have the following choices regarding their solo experience:

- A. Non-proficiency solo for 9th 12th grade students Perform only your solo for the adjudicator
- B. Proficiency solo for 10th 12th grade students Perform your solo and scales/stick control exercises for the adjudicator. Proficiency solos will be used in the nomination for Spring MYAF events.

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#### **Music Requirements:**

- 1. Please list the title of the piece and the publisher on this form. Mr. Ash may have to contact the publisher to gain permission for you to perform it virtually..
- 2. Each soloist event must upload their score into OpusEvent with each measure numbered. They must also show the original sheet music at the beginning of their video.
- 3. Non-proficiency solo events will be allowed six minutes for their performance.
- 4. All proficiency events will be allowed six minutes for solos and three minutes for scales/etudes/stick control

#### **Accompanist:**

- 1. If an accompaniment is written, it is recommended but not required.
- 2. The presence or absence of accompaniment will have no bearing on the final rating.
- 3. Accompaniment can be provided in live, recorded, or digital form (like smartmusic).
- 4. Any accompaniment (live, recorded, or digital) must only include the accompaniment part or no rating will be given

#### **Medals and Rating Adjustments:**

- 1. Medals are available for non-proficiency events. Students performing a non-proficiency event receiving a Division I rating are entitled to a blue solo & ensemble medal. Those students performing a non-proficiency event receiving a Division II rating are entitled to a red solo & ensemble medal.
- 2. Medals are also available for the Proficiency Examination section. Students who receive a score of 52 to 62 are entitled to a red

proficiency medal, and those whose score is 63 or better are entitled to a blue proficiency medal.				
3. Medals will be purchased separately through Bale Company. Students will additionally pay for medals. Directors will order all medals after and receive them for distribution.
